Strengthening the quality of education at North Eastern Province Technical Training Institute (NEP TTI)



G-Youth's Support to NEP TTI

In its pilot phase, G-Youth strengthened the North Eastern Province Technical Training Institute through an institutional assessment, a labor market assessment and a marketing and outreach campaign. These and other initiatives led to a 50 percent increase in enrolment.

Institutional Assessment

One of G-Youth's first activities was to conduct an assessment of NEP TTI's institutional resources, performance and ability to link its graduates to the employment market based on the quality of programs and course offerings. Five areas for strengthening were identified: marketing, financial aid, course offerings, institutional capacity, and career guidance and counseling. The key findings and a strategy for strengthening the institution were presented to the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Technology (MOHEST) and NEP TTI's management, staff and Board.

Labor Market Assessment

G-Youth and MOHEST participated in a labor market assessment led by EcoVentures International (EVI). The purpose of the assessment was to assess and identify markets where employment opportunities exist for NEP TTI graduates. It found that "...the most significant immediate employment opportunities in the ICT sector are in PC troubleshooting – assisting users with everyday problems with their hardware, and networking – assisting offices to connect computers and share information. ... Nearly all government and NGO offices have computer systems--but few if any have in-house expertise in troubleshooting or network maintenance." The project also conducted a workshop for NEP TTI on how to conduct ongoing assessments on market trends that can determine the demand for technical/vocational course offerings at NEP TTI.

Marketing NEP TTI

G-Youth led a rigorous marketing and outreach campaign with the goal of increasing Garissa youth's appreciation of technical training as a viable career option and encouraging them to enroll at NEP TTI. Marketing of NEP TTI was done through G-Youth's website and Facebook page, SMS

blasts, distributing NEP TTI brochures, encouraging “work readiness” graduates to enroll, and organizing Open Days for over 700 high school students. The results: a 50% increase in enrollment at NEP TTI.

New Activities at NEP TTI

G-Youth is now strengthening NEP TTI in new ways:

- 1) by setting up a CISCO Networking Academy, where youth can become certified in IT Essentials and CISCO Certified Networking Associate (CCNA) for a nominal fee;
- 2) by helping to strengthen alliances with private sector employers for internships, apprenticeships and employment of their graduates.

The CISCO Networking Academy will serve as an ICT Centre of Excellence. It addresses the local need for certified professionals in the ICT sector while increasing Garissa youth’s employability.
